Research questions in development are:

- Over the last 10-years, how has the distribution of disinvestment in parks varied, by geographic region as well as by area deprivation level, within Birmingham?
- How do LA, communities and wider stakeholders talk about the value generated from parks?
- How can we co-create a framework to measure the value from parks utilising all data that exists (e.g. police, parks, volunteers)?
- How can we use this framework to measure the impact of the Fair Park Standard in terms of:
 - a. Costing the Fair Park Standard from multiple perspectives.
 - b.Understanding variation in implementation within and between parks
 - c.Tracking impact of the Fair Park Standard on metrics such as park-use, physical activity, population health and wellbeing.
- Can a public narrative leadership approach be used to support officers within BCC to lead change for parks?
